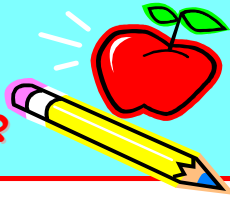

## Preparing for the NJ ASK

Even though you do not know exactly what will be on the test, it does not mean that you cannot prepare for it. The structure of the test is always the same.

If he/she has math homework, balance your checkbook or pay some bills. Show them that what they are doing in school relates to what you have to do as an adult.

## Reminders to Students

## Getting Ready for the SATs/ACTs

When practicing for the Writing/English sections, read each question aloud. If it sounds right, it probably is right. The more you practice this the better you will do on your test. On test day, make sure you bring extra batteries or even an extra calculator. While the test says that the math sections can be done without a calculator, you do not want to test that theory.
