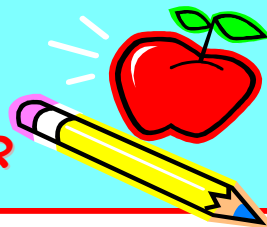

Challenge!

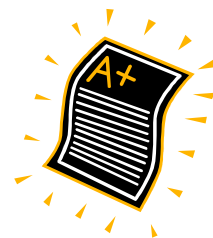
Verbal Challenge

Writing Tip of the Month

Use active voice in your stories.

Active voice puts the active subject first, followed by the verb (the action), followed by the object of the action. Active voice is stronger and moves the action along. Passive voice reverses the order.

Example:

Active - *Sam hit the ball.*

Passive - *The ball was hit by Sam.*
